Why Many Students Abandon their Faith.

Just recently, I was again reminded of how many students abandon their faith after they leave for college or university. There have been recent surveys that show over 65% of high school students stopped attending church after high school. There are indications that that number might even be higher. There appears to be a gap after students leave their youth groups and home churches and move on from high school into further education or the work force. Many appear to not be prepared for the challenges that colleges and universities might present to them.

What ever the actual number of students who stop attending church we know it is high. It should make us question, “why is this happening?” Do we prepare our children enough for the challenges and questions that they will encounter in higher education? Do we train our students enough to form their own questions and wrestle with them in an honest environment where questions can be asked? Do we encourage them to struggle with these questions and bring them to God just as David did as recorded in the Psalms? We need to teach our children how to think critically and to be able to discern.

Our youth need to able to stand their ground in areas of temptation that they are exposed to everyday but maybe more so on university and college campuses. What are we teaching them in the way that we live as parents? What are the messages we are giving in teaching them what it means to be successful? As a parent I struggle with this because I am too influenced by what the world is teaching.

Our challenge at NCS is to provide a community that strives to promote Christian community, discernment, calling and discipleship. We hope that our students have been, and are given the tools to deal with the issues that will come up when our faith is challenged. Let us continue to journey together in this important task.
