### School Organization

Welcome to school! We trust your introduction to school last week was a pleasant one. In order to better serve and govern the community's overall health and welfare the board has decided to add additional staffing due to class increases. The decisions were difficult in the context of the defined parameters of last spring's approved budget. The board has to address the financial pressures that we already face in a planned deficit year, largely due to the new facility.

The first day showed overflowing classrooms in kindergarten, four, five, six, nine, ten and eleven. We greatly enjoy the tremendous blessing this brings (we have never seen so many classes of such student numbers in our history!). As has been said many times before: "God is good! and ...these are good problems to have".

Often large classes that are near to our defined limit may receive a classroom assistant depending on the nature of the class and its size. With another adult present, individual student supervision responsibilities and having the class managed for a more effective learning climate answer immediate classroom management concerns. Prior to school starting the board met to plan its priorities and clearly defined the value for doing its best to create the most effective and responsible structures for school organization. There was similar concern expressed to support the staff where student numbers exceed our policy for class sizes. Therefore, given the contextual and financial parameters, the board approved and prioritized:

- the splitting of the grade nine class up to a possible maximum of an approximately 60% additional teacher to be reviewed at the end of semester one.
- the hiring of the Gr. 1-8 French (as a second language) teacher –introducing Mrs. T. Gradica!\*
- Mr. Banman is assigned to teach voice in drama
- The 'capping' of kindergarten enrolment and having to start a waiting list.

One may conclude, and rightly so, that the board of directors has swiftly acted with care while having to exercise prudence. This may not satisfy everyone's specific interests. We experienced an unexpected 'scramble' this year due to the unprecedented need to accommodate the Beacon Christian School restructuring that caused twelve more students to be enrolled at NCS. The NCS board graciously assumed the responsibility to make Christian education available to mid-island families who lost that option as BCS decided to no longer offer gr. 4-6 classes. \*

Since there are many families impacted by these recommendations you are encouraged to consider your situation and forward any questions you may have to the class teachers and administration. The educational administration team is staffed as follows:

- Mrs. S. De Schiffart, Special education, admissions and student placement,
- Mr. D. Spyksma, K-8 vice principal,
- Mr. B. De Schiffart, High School vice-principal,
- Mr. J. Reems, Principal.

The administration team is working to resolve organizational and student concerns as quickly as possible. Where there were difficulties we apologize for any misunderstandings that may have occurred. If we are unavailable you may leave messages at the office and we will respond as soon as we are able. We thank you for your patience, understanding and cooperation as we move forward with the best possible structure(s) and educational plans for our students. We look forward to serving you this year.

**BCS/NCS Joint Task Force\***

Prior to school starting both boards of Nanaimo and Beacon Christian School met in order to plan a reorganization of their operations. This was conducted by the Society of Christian School in B.C.'s executive director, Mr. H. Contant. BCS reviewed their situation and decided to restructure its school organization. This occurred as a result of a 'lower than hoped for' enrolment that caused an overall budget deficit that was declared unsustainable. Hence, the dramatic reduction to the smaller operation of Kindergarten to grade three on the current campus, under the teaching responsibility of Mrs. D. Baker and the administration of Principal B. Judd. The review process involved NCS participation in order to explore the possibilities of continuing the offering of Christian education to the effected families. This was offered and gratefully accepted by the BCS board.

While the impact of operating the Beacon Christian School at the Nanoose Bay Campus was a blessing for such a long time the BCS board recognized that it would be more desirable to relocate directly in the Parksville/Qualicum area. Their aim is to do so as soon as possible and they are currently examining various options to relocate. This was a very difficult matter that involved releasing their valued staff and hosting a parental meeting. It was an emotional time of releasing the blessing of that particular place that had impacted so many families.

The NCS board graciously assumed the responsibility to make Christian education available to mid-island families who lost that option as BCS decided to no longer offer gr. 4-6 classes. \* Therefore, we ask for your understanding as our grade 4,5, and 6 classes flowed over class size limitations at the last hour of school starting.

BCS and NCS has agreed to jointly launch a task force to make recommendations for the relocation of the BCS campus and the future amalgamation of the two Christian education societies. The board has approved the appointment of Mr. J. Van Rensburg, Mr. J. Reems and Mrs. C. Finlay to this responsibility. There is every reason to be thankful to the Lord for his many blessings for a generation of Christian education to be served to students on the Beacon campus since 1993. We are thankful for God's faithfulness during this time and to pray for it to continue as we search out His will. Our desire is to have a vibrant, thriving and relocated Christian elementary school in Nanaimo's neighbouring Oceanside community.

**Vaccinations**

Last spring the education committee reviewed the latest vaccination offer for the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) by the public health authority. It was affirmed that the primary responsibility for the authorization of any such vaccination program is the parent's decision. Consequently, we will continue to offer vaccinations on campus as an extension of the Public Health authority program. Should you have any comment or question in this regard you may contact the administration or education committee. The education committee currently consists of Mr. D. Lindsay, Pastor J. Toews, Mrs. C. Fehr, and Mrs. A. Sevenhuysen.

Families are reminded to return the grade 6 and 9 consent forms to the school as soon as possible. Thank you for your attention and consideration in this matter.
